In the event that more than the required number of Trustees receive more than 50% of the votes during an individual ballot, the highest number will decide the election. Thereafter, the Alternates will be elected on a "one at a time" basis. This is required as Alternates are designated 1st. 2nd, etc. Therefore, the highest vote received, who receives more than 50% of the total vote, will be the only elected Alternate on a given ballot.
