January 2019

During the month of January, we lost our second committee member due to work and personal commitments. That brings the committee head count to 6. The remainder of the states that were not proceeding with boundary definition, now has to be split between the remaining members of the committee. Interestingly enough, reassignment of these states has been an easy task, as the committee members are quick to volunteer to take on the additional workload.

Our next phase is to get a verbal commitment from the individual areas that comprise each state on exactly what they wish their county boundaries to be. This information will hopefully be compiled during the February meeting. During the January committee meeting, the committee agreed to a draft of what will ultimately sent to the individual areas in which there is multiple area overlap.

We have 2 meetings left before the agenda closes on 3/30. It seems very optimistic to think that we will have a completed task in time for the Louisville Trustee meeting. Our expectation is for a detailed listing of all the affected states and the progress we have achieved. Although the attachments may be available for the Trustees, they will not become official until the Board of Trustees votes in favor of all the included states.
